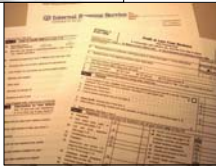

Soup Bowls for Hunger 2003

This year *Soup Bowls for Hunger* will be held Wednesday April 16, 2003.

Congratulations to Hollis Engley for being the first to turn in his donation of soup bowls for this, our 11th year of this fundraiser! Bowls are due anytime now, the sooner the better. Don't make us hound you with reminder calls.

For those of you who are new members, this is our big fundraiser to help those folks on the Cape who are finding it increasingly difficult to put food on the table. We collect over 600 bowls and sell tickets at \$12 each, which entitles each patron to receive one bowl filled with hot yummy soup and a crusty roll courtesy of Cape Cod Regional Technical High School's culinary arts department, our hosts.

This charitable fundraising effort brings out most of the potters working on the Cape, along with the art departments at several local schools,

to make the bowls. The Girl Scouts, and this year the Nauset High School Interact Club, assist with decorating the paper bag placemats, set-up and service during the meal.

Each year we raise over \$8000 for the Family Pantry, which is the drop-off for the Boston Food Bank, serving all the needs of Cape Cod.

So hurry up with those bowls. Please make them large enough to hold 1½ cups of soup and drop them off at the Creative Arts Center, Chatham; Diane Heart Pottery, Brewster; Kemp Pottery, Orleans; or Ron Dean Pottery, Marstons Mills.

Welcome to Our Membership

We are pleased to welcome all our returning and new members. This newsletter is published four to five times a year. We also send out postcards and other information as needed. This is a brief list of major activities.

Annually:

In January we hold our annual membership enlistment, workshop, meeting and pot-luck dinner. The workshop, pot-luck dinner and annual meeting (held on one day) is usually held on Sunday between the third week of January and the first week of February. A member of the Cape Cod Potters, Inc. will hold a workshop on some aspect of their work, such as wax resist, throwing, glazing, decoration etc. Following the workshop we hold a pot-luck dinner at a members home (we try to alternate the location each year). We then have our annual meeting, we elect the executive board, bring members up to date information on what has transpired throughout the year and attend to any new business. All members are urged and welcome to attend, we ask members to bring some food to share.

In April of each year the Cape Cod Potters, Inc. in association with the Cape Cod Regional Technical High School hold Super Bowls for Hunger. We raise money for the Family Pantry which dispenses food for people in need across the Cape. We ask each of our members for a donation of at least six to twelve soup bowls (many more if possible) that hold about a cup and a half of soup. We sell about six hundred tickets at \$12.00 each for a "soup line" dinner. The patrons get their choice of soup bowl, filled with soup, roll and a choice of coffee or water, sit and enjoy the meal. They then get to take their soup bowl home with them as a reminder of the evenings purpose. We raise between \$8000. to \$9500. each year, all proceeds from the sale of the tickets is donated to the Family Pantry.

Some of members when possible hold "Summer" sales/exhibitions.

In October of each year, Sunday of the weekend after Columbus Day, we hold our annual Seconds Sale. The seconds are donated by our members who drop them off at Eve Carey's home (in the basement) throughout the year, we need your seconds to sell at this function. The proceeds from the sale are used for our workshops, scholarships, grants and subsidize educational programs. We need volunteers, if would like to help with this event please contact any executive board member.

In November/December some of our members usually hold a Christmas or holiday sale/exhibition.

Throughout the year:

We hold workshops and lectures; executive meetings (all welcome to attend); special interest meetings to plan workshops and work out schedules.

Members may participate in the group bulk supply order (twice a year, spring and fall). Members get group discount pricing and reduced shipping costs.

What members can do:

Members are encouraged to attend an executive meeting, put workshops together (the executive board will guide you along the way), donate and take part in Soup Bowls for Hunger, serve on special committees for workshops and events. Participate in member sales and exhibitions and help educate the public in the arts, pottery and our group. If you have a question or need information contact any board member.
