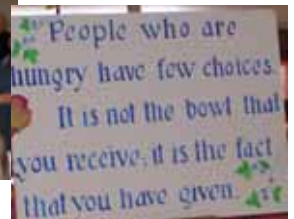

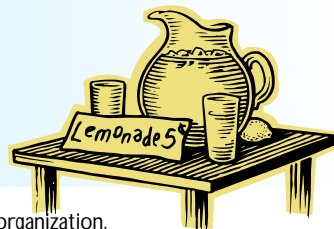
gance, who have donated paper goods and flowers for this yearly event since its inception.
