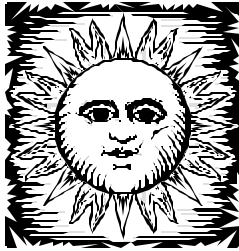

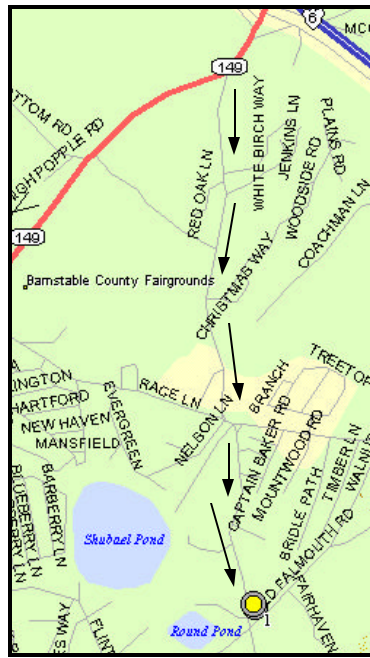


## From the Vice President, Ron Dean Exploratory Meeting on Legal Matters

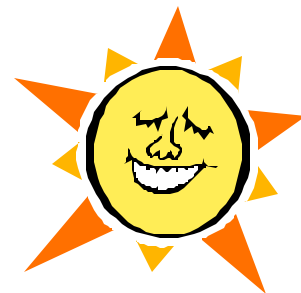

Hello:

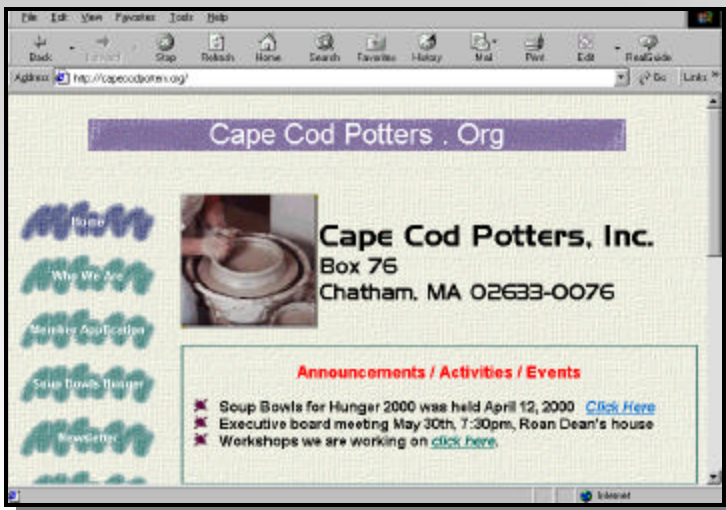

## Seconds Sale

Make room in your studio now! Clear out all of those seconds and bring them to Eden Pottery on the corner of our route 6A, Sesuit Neck Road and Dr. Lord's Road in Dennis.

The seconds sale is usually the first Sunday after Columbus Day weekend. But unless you bring us the pots beforehand we don't even know if we have enough pots to have a sale. So please bring us pots continuously throughout the year.

The proceeds from this sale are used to support the mentoring programs, scholarships, workshops, videos, etc.

When you get to Eden Pottery just walk toward the bulkhead (their gallery will now be on your right with the Eden painted doors) on the house and store your seconds in the basement toward the back. No need to bother Eve or John just place your pots in their basement.

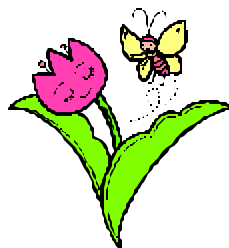

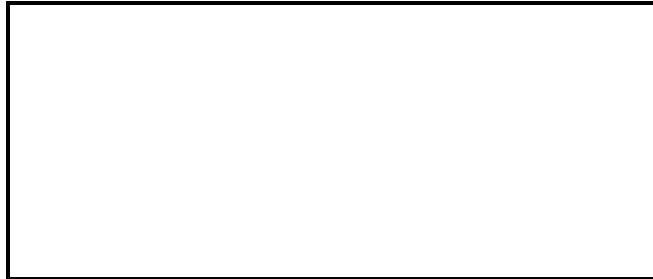
