There will be an executive board meeting on Tuesday November 6th, at 7:30 PM at the home of Ron Dean, all members are welcome.

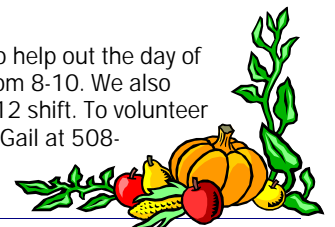
Seconds Sale

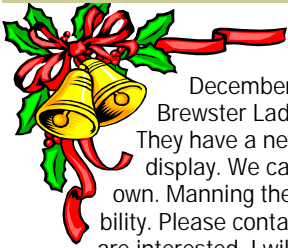

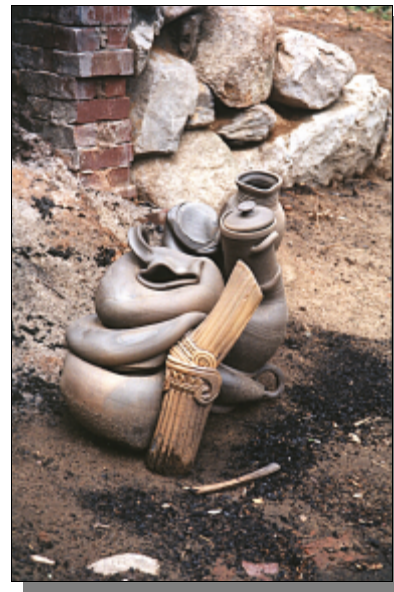
Plimouth Plantation 1st Firing of kiln

Fall Bulk Supplies Order

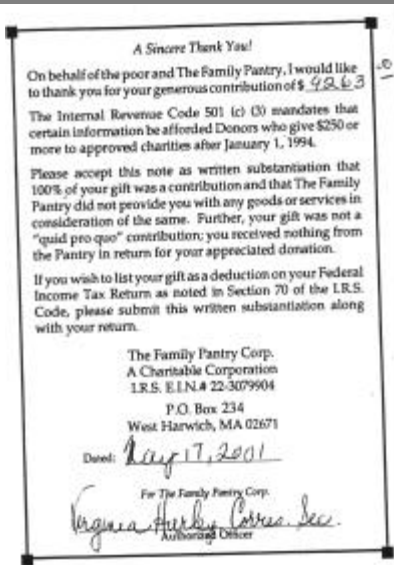
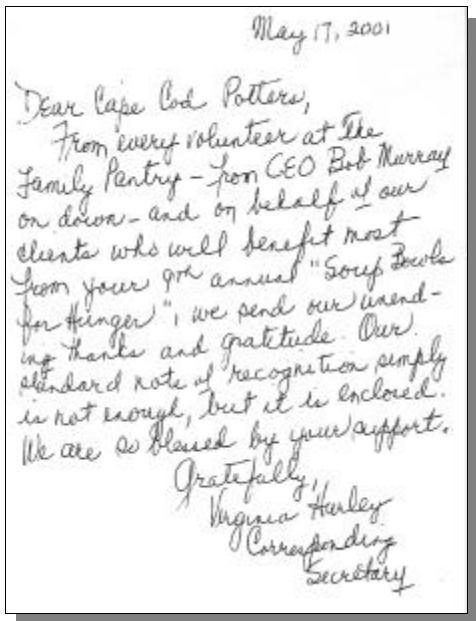

Donation to the Arts Internship Program

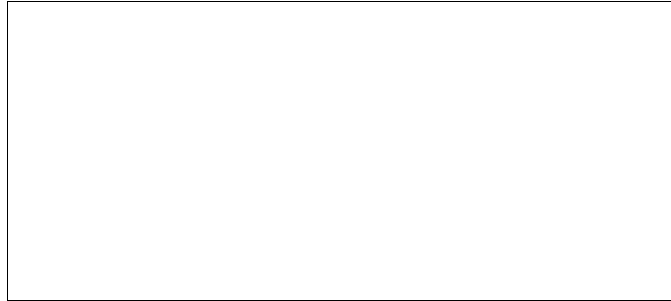

Wayne Cardinalli Workshop - November 16th, 17th and 18th

We are fortunate to get Wayne Cardinalli back to do a workshop for us. He last did a work shop with us about five years ago. His workshops are easy-going and light but, contain an incredible amount of technical and common sense information. Since Wayne Cardinalli graduated with an M.F.A. from Tyler School of Art in Philadelphia in 1977, his work has gone through several shifts in direction from the exuberant early salt-glazed ware, to a whimsical sculptural "gargoyle" period, to the elegant pink-glazed stoneware, as well as the sturdy ash-glazed functional tableware for which he has become known. Through all these changes in style, the elements that have remained constant are his exploration of direct gestural distortions of the freshly thrown form and a subtle painterly approach to the glaze surface. The inspiration for the body of work shown recently at Ashton's in Toronto was a gold glaze he found in *Ceramics Monthly*. This is a testimonial to the spirit of generosity in the ceramics community. Although all the pieces are vessels (vases, lidded jars, bowls and plates), function is not the prime concern. The main emphasis of the work is the rich, tarnished gold surface of the glaze as it relates to the twisted or rippled skin of clay. These undulations allow the glaze to pool and glisten as the light moves across the surface. The gold glaze



is combined most effectively with either a blue or a red glaze, and all the glaze surfaces (in their various combinations) are handsome complements to the fluidly thrown and constructed forms.
